### Q. What kind of work can I get done?

Some of the more common work includes A Some of the more common adding insulation, reducing drafts (air sealing), and repairing or upgrading heating systems. The participating contractor who does your home assessment can give you additional information on what can be done to improve the energy efficiency, health and safety, and durability of your home.

#### I've heard a lot about carbon monoxide problems in some homes. Will my contractor check for this?

Yes. The participating contractor will check carbon monoxide levels when doing a home assessment. Should a carbon monoxide problem be present, the contractor must correct it before any other work can be done on the home.

### **Q**. Are there incentives for apartment building owners?

Yes, incentives are available to the owner. if the owner or tenants in a 1- to 4-family building are income-eligible. The amount of the incentive depends on the incomeeligibility of the owner or the number of income-eligible tenants.
